Meeting Summary

The meeting began with Superintendent Matt Bishop welcoming the team members. He spoke briefly about how the Board of Education came to the decision to go through this process. He introduced Jeff Parker and Todd Thackery from SHP Leading Design.

Each participant was randomly seated in 10 different tables. At the tables, each person was to state their name, their connection to the district, and their favorite class in school. Next, Jeff Parker presented the slideshow that was shown during the recent Community Outreach Forum. Superintendent Matt Bishop and Treasurer Lori Green gave highlights of the district and financial information. Jeff Parker showed survey responses from the previous forum.

Jeff Parker and Todd Thackery then presented the “previous plan” that was defeated three times at the ballot to build two new schools. At the tables, members created a list of Pros and Cons for that plan and then identified two of the most critical items for each. Tables shared their lists. Next, members discussed their “personal values” for a successful school(s). Each member wrote six values and then the group identified a shared group to report out to the larger group.

We did not have enough time to discuss options and solutions that should be considered (number of buildings, grades, locations, etc.). This will be the first thing we do at the next meeting.
