Bond Issue and Income Tax March 17th Election Information

Our district embarked on a comprehensive community engagement process. The purpose was to recommend a facilities master plan to our Board of Education. A **Community Advisory Team** met frequently throughout the 2018-19 school year. The group was comprised of many community members with differing viewpoints on the best way to achieve our facility goals. **Community Outreach Forums** were held to summarize progress, provide input, and allow for a transparent process.

THE NEED

All three of our buildings require extensive renovations. When examining the costs, it was evident that partnering with the Ohio Facilities Construction Commission (OFCC) to cover a majority of costs was best. This allows us to reduce the number of buildings from three to two. It was also clear that we should keep the Jr/Sr High School building and use our carryover to renovate the mechanical systems and add air conditioning. The final need was our operating budget. It was evident that we need to return to the amount of local funding we received from 2005-2015.

THE PLAN

Our **Preble Shawnee Facilities Master Plan** is based from the following data: OFCC costs and figures, Community Advisory Team meetings, Community Forums, a professional scientific survey, ongoing discussions among stakeholders, and cost estimates from independent contractors.

NEW PK-5 BUILDING IN CAMDEN

- ⇒ Funded through partnership with OFCC paying 66% of the base cost and Preble Shawnee responsible for 34%
- ⇒ Our share of the project will total \$10,155,365
- ⇒ 3.75 mill **Bond Issue** for a term of 25-Years

RENOVATION OF JR/SR HIGH SCHOOL

- ⇒ Using approximately \$6 million of existing carryover to fund first phase of renovations
- ⇒ Replacement of mechanical systems (i.e. boilers, plumbing, electrical, ceilings, technology, security), addition of LED lighting and air conditioning
- ⇒ Future phases will include roofing, flooring, windows, and casework

OPERATION OF DISTRICT

GENERAL INFORMATION

- ⇒ **.75% Income Tax** will be on the ballot
- ⇒ Term is 5-Years
- ⇒ Tax will be used for operating expenses as well as future renovations
- ⇒ If passed, the percentage of income tax collections would match the total from 2005-2015

WHAT FORMS OF INCOME ARE TAXED?

- ⇒ Income from wages, salaries, tips, interest, annuities, IRA distributions, unemployment compensation, capital gains, self-employment, pensions, alimony, state/local bond interest and dividends

WHAT IS NOT TAXED?

- ⇒ Income from social security, workers' compensation benefits, child support, welfare benefits, property received as a gift or inheritance, or disability and survivor benefits
